Who we are

North East Lincolnshire SENDIASS provides a Service that:

- Supports parents/carers of a child with SEND
- Supports children/young people up to the age of 25 who have SEND, who wish to access the service independently
- is impartial, confidential, arms length, free and accessible

North East Lincolnshire SENDIASS was formally known as **Parent Partnership Service (PPS)**. From 1st September 2014 every PPS within every local authority evolved into Information, Advice and Support Services.

North East Lincolnshire SENDIASS has been outsourced to Barnardo's and is jointly funded by Barnardo's and North East Lincolnshire Council.

As a Barnardo's Service we value the independent nature of our work and will always put children and young people first, taking their views into account wherever possible.

Our Services

North East Lincolnshire SENDIASS provides:

- A telephone helpline service - 01472 355365
- Information and Support for parents, carers, children and young people
- Support to schools in developing positive relationships with parents
- Written information, also available online
- Information sessions for parents and carers
- Advice and support in relation to school admissions and appeals
- Training for professional staff and school governors
- Information on Education Health & Care Assessments and Plans
- Provide information on the Local Offer



We help you:

- By listening to your views and concerns
- By working with you to explore your options
- With preparation and supporting you at meetings
- To find confidence to express your views
- With forms, letters and reports
- To understand your rights in relation to SEND
- To work in partnership with schools and the local authority to develop positive relationships
- Understand jargon
- To make informed decisions
